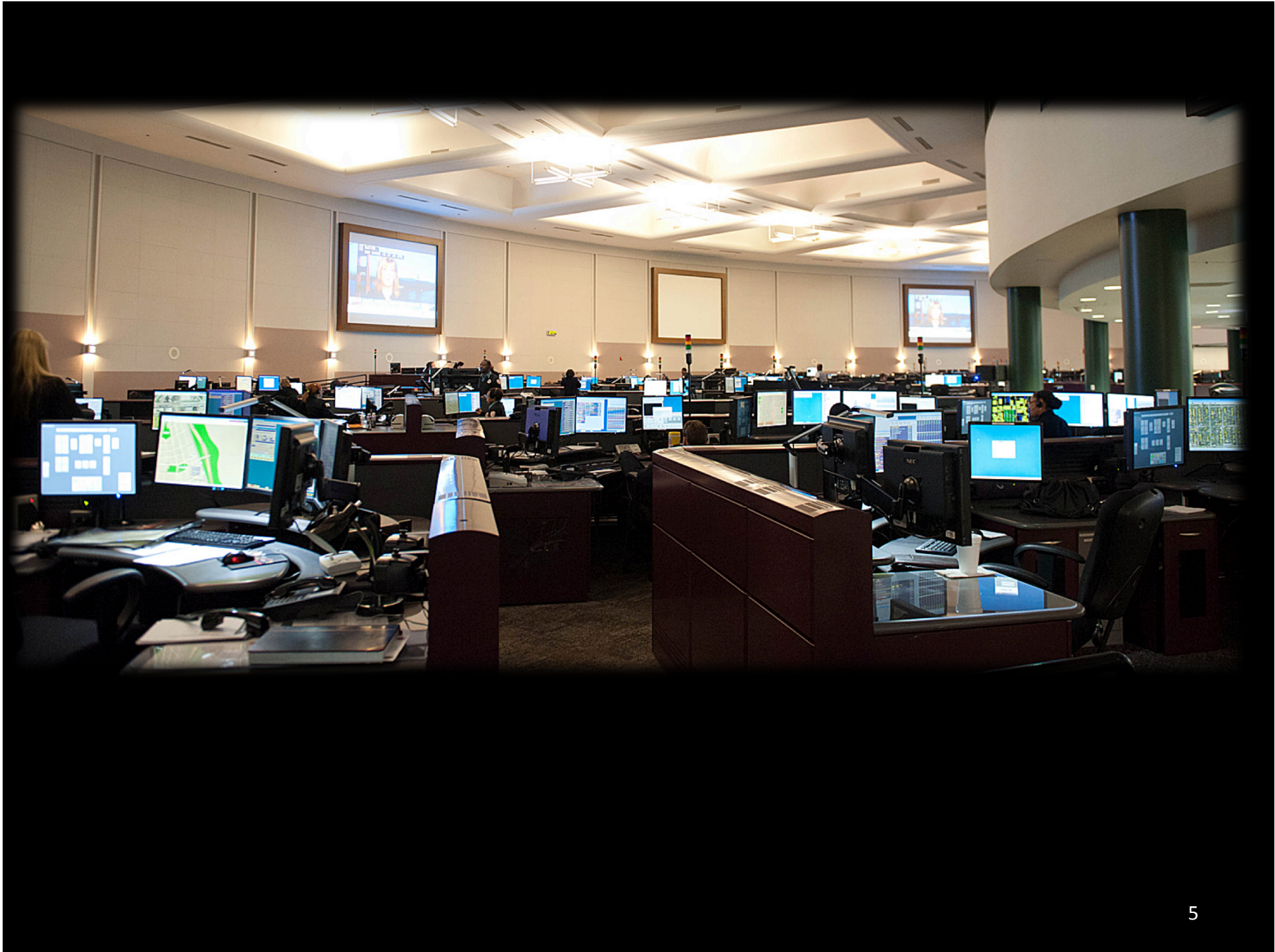

Per Metra, extensive delays expected on Milwaukee District North, Milwaukee District West and North Central lines. Inbound and outbound train service will be limited until further notice due to a train derailment involving North Central Service train #107 near Western Avenue. Commuters are encouraged to seek alternate forms of transportation which include other Metra lines, CTA, and PACE. CTA Brown line will honor Metra tickets from downtown Chicago to Kimball and CTA Blue line will honor Metra tickets from downtown to O'Hare. Please contact RTA at 312-836-7000 for alternate transportation information. Crews are working to correct this issue. Estimated time of delays are unknown but extensive delays are anticipated. Metra will provide updated information as it becomes available.

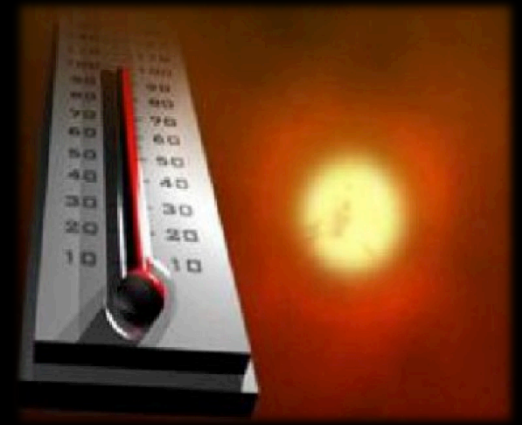
1995 Heat Wave

- On July 12, 1995, a dangerous hot-air mass settled over Chicago, producing three consecutive days of temperatures over 99 degrees Fahrenheit and heat indices around 120.
- Over 700 related deaths.
- Thousands were hospitalized for heat-related problems.



2012 Heat Wave

- June 27-July 9, 2012: Chicago experienced four (4) days of temperatures above 100 degrees with heat indices in excess of 105 degrees.
- Chicago reached 100° for three consecutive days from July 4th-6th, tying the existing records as the second warmest 3-day average for Chicago.
- 18 heat-related deaths.


